## How to care for your tulips...

*Tulips rarely survive if grown in a pot for a second year. Remove each tulip flower after it finishes blooming.*

- ❖ **Ideal Conditions: 50-70 degrees F in full sunlight**
- ❖ **Dispose of the bulbs or transplant to a garden bed after the foliage yellows and dies back naturally**
- ❖ **Indoor plants usually require watering once to twice weekly**
- ❖ **Outdoor pots may require watering as often as once daily**
